ENTIRE – STAKEHOLDER DIALOGUE APPROACH



The complex challenges of integrated water resource management are far too complex to be solved by the public sector, civil society or private sector acting alone. **Cooperation is Key!**

In high quality Stakeholder Dialogues differences hold the **potential for innovative solutions** and the achievement of goals that ultimately benefit all.





ENTIRE – THE STAKEHOLDER DIALOGUE APPROACH



The stakeholder approach strengthens the commitment of involved actors to common goals:

- by building trust-based relationships between stakeholders
- through finding effective ways of engaging stakeholders into a result-oriented and constructive collaboration
- by harvesting collective intelligence and individual expertise
- through ensuring commitment for implementation

ENTIRE - EXPECTED RESULTS



- Institutional capacity of project partners and networks members in the water sector in the targeted countries is enhanced.
- Multi-stakeholder dialogues on Water Conservation as part of IWRM are improved. A stakeholder platform on Water Conservation is initiated in Jordan, Palestine and Egypt.
- **Best practice exchange** on IWRM are made available to collaborating institutions and relevant key actors.





ENTIRE - EXPECTED RESULTS



- CSO networks are trained to deliver capacity building programmes for the implementation and monitoring of stakeholder dialogue processes and will adopt this training module into their capacity building portfolio.
- A **web-based support** platform on stakeholder dialogues including online tools for continuous learning and best-practice exchange is established and made available for a broad audience.





ENTIRE - KEY INDICATORS



- 60 representatives are trained on stakeholder dialogue methodology from targeted countries.
- 20 representatives from the partners and their networks completed a '**Train the Trainer**' (TTT) course.
- Two multi-stakeholder networking events addressing key water conservation aspects are implemented and attended by 80 participants (representatives from the Government, CSOs, donor agencies, experts, and media).





ENTIRE - KEY INDICATORS



- A **bi-annual newsletter** of the project is published and distributed.
- A **web-portal** for stakeholder engagement in IWRM is functioning.
- Compilation of best practice examples from Germany and the region in a handbook on Stakeholder Dialogues is available online for download.
- **Trainings** on stakeholder dialogues became an integral component of partners' training portfolios.





ENTIRE - ACHIEVEMENTS



- Project partners from ACWUA and RAED received a one month training on Stakeholder Dialogues including exposure trips to relevant German water stakeholders.
- The ENTIRE project team has been formed as the core group and planned the project further.
- A project website has been launched.
- A **baseline study** to assess the level of experiences of ACWUA and RAED members in stakeholders dialogue has been conducted.





ENTIRE - ACHIEVEMENTS




- **High-level support** from the honored Jordanian Minister of Water and Irrigation for the ENTIRE kick-off event.
- Water Conservation was identified by the project team and through a survey among the network members from ACWUA and RAED.
- Participants from ACWUA and RAED networks were identified for the first training on Stakeholder Dialogues in water conservation.
